



Kinzler talks of planting trees, readying lawns

Rotarian of the Day Jon Riewer introduced one of our favorite guests, NDSU horticulturist Don Kinzler. When last he joined us, he was talking about waking up lawn and garden for spring. Now he was on hand to discuss putting them to bed in the fall. Jon confided as he welcomed Don, "I'm as excited as a groupie at a Hairball concert!"

The horticulturist advised us to enjoy the process of autumn tasks and look at them as an investment in next spring. Now is a good time to seed lawns, he said ... if you're quick about it. (Before Oct. 1 was his recommendation.) He also said this is the best time to apply fertilizer and herbicides, but again — do it right now. "Even a frost doesn't kill the weeds," he warned.

Fall is also the time for a final mowing at a height of just 1.5 inches around the middle of October. Instead of raking, leaves can be run over with a mower and mulched into the lawn.

Fall is also a good time to plant trees and shrubs. "And remember to water your evergreens," he added. Trunk guards can be added to young trees to protect from rabbits. He advised wrapping them for their first five years, until the bark roughens.
