HOW OFTEN SHOULD WE MEET?

- Meeting 3 times a month from Oct 2022 to Jun 2023 would reduce catering costs for the year by \$2,800
- Meeting bi-weekly would reduce annual costs by \$6,400
- Week off might facilitate more service projects, board meetings, or other special events.
- Fewer meetings may incent members to attend more regularly
- Would enable club to avoid an increase in member fees in the near future, and potentially contribute additional funds

2022-23 BUDGET CONSIDERATIONS

- Final, lower installment of our 5 year Kovash commitment
- No "5 club" (natural playground) payment
- Continue Culturally Diverse Library Book project
- Increase level of ongoing "community" donations
- Reduce cost of our 3rd grade classroom project (Globe)
- Includes funding for sponsoring exchange student
- Cost of our catered lunches is increasing about 15%
- No Rotary grant proceeds reflected
- Assumes existing membership fee structure
- Key to holding fees stable: our MAPS meeting venue
