Carlsen Center brings community-based services to new Moorhead location

Rotarian of the Day Eric Wilkie introduced speaker Sally Tobin, a licensed social worker on the staff of the new Anne Carlsen Service Center that has opened at 3030 24th Ave. S. in Moorhead. The office is the first Moorhead location for the venerable Jamestown-based North Dakota organization, which also operates in six other North Dakota cities including Fargo.

Sally said the Moorhead office, which opened its

doors this summer, is staffed by mental health professionals, technology experts and a variety of therapists — behavioral, speech and occupational therapy. They serve patients from throughout the Dakotas and Minnesota, either with or without insurance; no one, she said, is excluded because of the level of challenges they face. They range from infancy through adulthood.

Sally said one in five children has a diagnosable mental health issue; it can take an average of eight years to identify it. The center provides office and in-home family therapy and support for children in their schools.

A major area, she said, is people on the autism spectrum, which new research suggests affects one in 50 children. New research, she added, ties it to fetal alcohol effects. The center held three summer camps for affected youngsters this summer on kid-friendly themes like Space Camp, the game Minecraft and CSI.

The move into Minnesota, she said, was prompted by many factors, including the availability and cost of their facility, better access for residents on both sides of the river, Minnesota’s superior level of funding, and access to technical supports and training.
