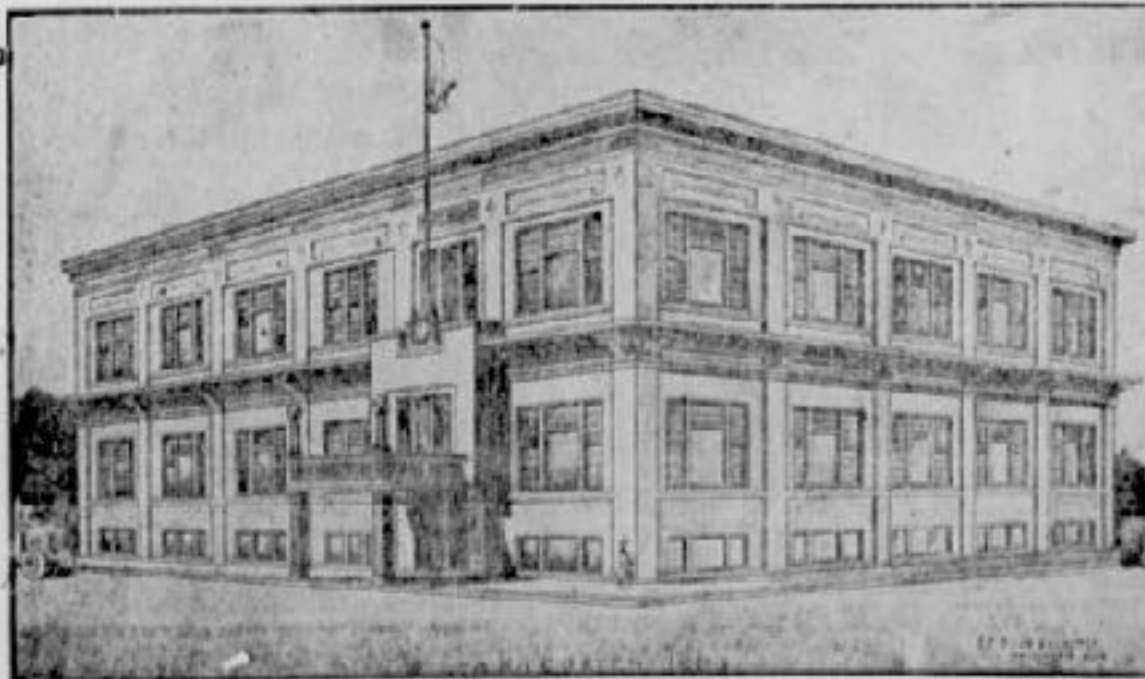

Construction of New Home of Anacortes Elks Lodge Is Being Rushed—As Completed Building Will Look



Just like the picture will the new Elks home appear before the date of the state convention here in August, and it is rapidly assuming the appearance given in the architect's drawing. This week the roof is being put on and will be completed by Friday night. The cornice is being made, the forms are being removed,

and the interior is being made ready for the plasterers. Wednesday cement was poured for the basement floor. Early in June the ball room and the lodge room will be turned over to the plasterers, while carpenters will be at work setting the lower floors into shape for the wall coverings. As soon as the plaster

From Dick Johnson's Club History 1993

It was front page news in the Anacortes American on November 24, 1922. A Rotary Club had been organized and an application had been made to Rotary International for a charter. The article contained the goals of a Rotary Club and could be used seventy years later for the same purpose. At that time, Rotary International had 30,000 members in 26 countries. By 1942 there were 210,000 members with 5,085 clubs and in April 1993 there were 1,163,614 members in 26,156 clubs in 187 countries.

A Very Merry Christmas

ANACORTES, WASH.—As their Christmas present to their district (first) governor, Percy B. Scurrah of Victoria, B. C., Anacortes Rotarians recently undertook a number of noteworthy community projects. Chief among these was a huge outdoor Christmas tree contest in which the

whole community participated. More than 800 school children and adults enjoyed the puppet show, "The Wizard of Oz," which the club sponsored. A community dance netted \$108 which was used to clean and decorate the club's weekly meeting place. At one meeting before Christmas, members brought sufficient toys to provide a joyous Christmas for all under-privileged children in the community. And a Christmas gift which probably pleased Governor Scurrah most was the announcement that in a two-month period the Anacortes Rotary Club increased its membership from 12 to 34.

Signs add history to walking trail up Cap Sante

New signs up and down the Rotary Trail at Cap Sante now give hikers a look back at Anacortes history, as well as a map of the area.

Seven interpretive signs are now in place along the roughly half-mile trail that leads from the woods next to the Anacortes Yacht Club to the summit of Cap Sante. They are from a collaboration between the Rotary Club of Anacortes, the Samish Indian Nation and the City of Anacortes.

Funding comes from the club, a grant from Rotary International and a City of Anacortes Lodging Tax grant.

Rotary Club member Jack Darnton started the process, which was then completed and finalized by Adam Farnsworth, with the Anacortes Museum.

The signs have historical information and

photos from the area and are situated to be closest to where the sign is displayed, Farnsworth said. A QR code on each sign will take visitors to websites where there is more audio and video history to explore. That site will see more regular updates, so even people who have walked by before can still learn something new, he said.

Information on the old amphitheater in the side of Cap Sante is located at the kiosk closest to where the amphitheater sits, for example, he said.

The signs are funded with tourism dollars, and having an online presence is one element of that, Farnsworth said.

"It's important to tell the story of Anacortes," he said.

Tom Wooten, chairman of the Samish Indian Nation, was on the committee to help with sign creation and information gathering. This is a great program that

helps let people know that this tribe has been here longer than the town has been here and that it is still here and active, Wooten said.

Growing up here, it wasn't uncommon to talk to people who didn't know anything about the Samish Indian Nation, he said.

He still runs into people who have never heard of the tribe.

Being included on signs like this will help with that, Wooten said.

Rotary Club members created the kiosks that now house the signs. City of Anacortes Parks and Recreation staff helped install them. It took about 500 volunteer hours to build the kiosks and clean up the trail, which reopened to the public in June.

Up next, the Rotary Club is looking at a new summit viewpoint looking east toward Mount Baker, including an ADA accessible trail and more signs.

THE GEOLOGY OF CAP SANTE

Cap Sante has a number of geological eccentricities, specifically, the summit of Cap Sante is made up of a sedimentary rock called *graywacke*—a particularly hard sandstone, usually a dark gray in color, and can have a angular grains of quartz, feldspar, and rock fragments embedded into it.



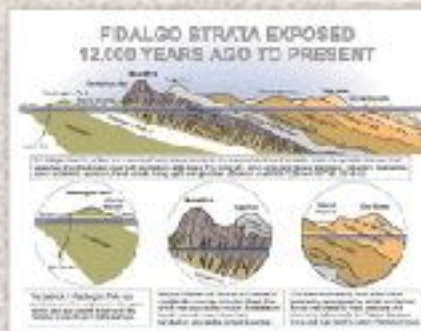
The graywacke was created from ocean sediment compressed by the weight of the ocean and tectonic forces between 120 and 170 million years ago. The large grooved lines across the graywacke were carved by glacier movement between 2 million to 12,000 years ago. About 2.6 million years ago, tectonic plate movement pushed the Fidalgo Complex up to its current height from the ocean floor.

FROM QUEBEC TO ANAGORITES

On what had been the site of a Finnish village—Qelach—the Amos and Arne (Curtis) Rowman purchased a quarter section of land on the northeast corner of Tida go Island in the 1870s, establishing the Annette post office in 1879, the Northwest Enterprise newspaper in 1882, and later a sawmill.

In 1892 the old growth forest was clearcut and a townsite plotted. The population boomed in 1890 from a few dozen to a few thousand in anticipation of the railroad's arrival. Anacortes was incorporated in 1901, but growth stagnated in the economic depression of 1893. Amos Brownman died the following year, as his dream of creating the "New York of the West" had settled into a reality of a small fishing and mill town.

SINCE TIME IMMEMORIAL

This land is the ancestral homeland of the *Sisseton Indian Nation*, whose citizens and tribal government remain active in the community to this day.

In 1891, a July 4th baseball game was played here (at approximately 6th Street and S Avenue) and a photograph made of the Guemes team, referred to in the *Anacortes American* as the "Indian baseball nine." Spanish Indian Nardim surnames on the Guemes team included Edwards, Blackinton, and Barkhausen.

Rotary started with the vision of one man — Paul Harris. The Chicago attorney formed the Rotary Club of Chicago on 23 February 1905, as a place where he and other businessmen could meet and discuss ways to improve their community.

The *Anacortes Rotary Club* charter was granted December 22, 1922, with seventeen charter members. At the chartering dinner the Bellingham Rotary club—which sponsored the Anacortes club—presented a gift of a brass Rotary bell that had been formed in Bellingham.

The Anacortes club has long devoted itself to the well-being of Anacortes youth by supporting health, education, athletics, and artistic expression. Students of the Month, foreign exchange students, and summer employment opportunities become traditional offerings from Rotary's carefree days.
