


FROM HIDDEN GEM TO CROWNING SUCCESS

ANACORTES ROTARY CENTENNIAL PROJECT TIMELINE—2018-2024

Club reviews 5 Legacy options, selects Rotary/Cap Sante upgrades as Centennial Legacy gift to community. Fundraising begins

June 2022, Rotary Viewpoint Trail opening ceremony draws a crowd. Viewpoint designs see more refinement. Two challenge grants spur funding drive.

Review of permit applications to begin. Construction expected in summer as Rotary aims for fall 2024 viewpoint opening.



TRAIL UPGRADES IN 2022

First phase of Anacortes Rotary's Centennial legacy gift is now complete—the Rotary Viewpoint Trail. The half-mile path invites all to leave their cars behind to enjoy woodland views, rocky ridges and distant vistas at the Cap Sante summit. Thanks to our generous donors, we now have a direct walking path from Rotary Park at the base to the Cap Sante crown, bringing these prized open spaces to light.

TRAIL IMPROVEMENTS— GETTING PEOPLE OUT OF CARS, ONTO PARK PATHWAYS

A key goal of the aims of the Rotary Centennial park improvements projects is to encourage people to take a healthy walk in the woods. We are promoting this free, beneficial exercise for residents and visitors alike with brochures and maps at the Chamber of Commerce visitors center, local hotels and motels and marinas.

In 2022, Anacortes Parks and Recreation crews tackled the trail upgrades, supplemented by 550 hours of volunteer work by club and community members. Highlights included enhancing the half-mile Rotary Viewpoint Trail, renovating the trailhead area and adding kiosks and wayfinding signs throughout the parks. In 2023, our volunteer teams continued their work, pruning trails, clearing garbage, adding protective coatings to kiosks and removing more invasive plants. More volunteer efforts are planned in 2024.
