Intro of guests included 3 Camarillo brothers who will be performing at the mariachi festival this weekend. They are rope trick artists and put on an amazing display of rope work. One time they even used an extension cord as a rope. When they were finished they called up Bill Murray & Norma Gallegos to show off their roping skills, which were very limited at best. But they were good sports about it.

Program was introduced by Past Pres Tom McNair. The Wenatchee High School Interact Club gave us the lowdown on their past, present & future activities. Club President is Rhiannon Schaub, Sarah Murray (Pres Bill's daughter?) is treasurer. First they were presented with 2 checks of \$400 each from Cascade Auto Center and Steve & Jane Baldock. Then the Club presented the group with a \$10,000 check from our auction proceeds.

Past projects have included a Rally for Allie, a sightless student. They raised \$6,000 and bought her some specialized equipment. Mothers in Mali was another project that raised \$16,000. They contributed \$5,000 to Ryans Well Foundation for construction of water wells in Africa, \$8,000 for UNICEF Aids work and \$10,000 Suicide Prevention locally.

They did a project for kids at Pybus market where they made gingerbread ornaments. They made & distributed 2,000 ribbons to remember the Paris terrorist attack, they distributed brochures to Wenatchee and Eastmont High Schools on suicide prevention & they worked on "Be The Light" walk for suicide awareness. They also participated in "Girl Rising Palms Up" to empower girls worldwide to be better educated.

This year's projects include raising \$50,000 for a Habitat For Humanity House. They have over \$30,000 to date. They created a "House of Life" song & video to publicize their project. 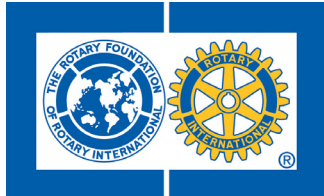
