Each club member in good standing is also a member of the Foundation.

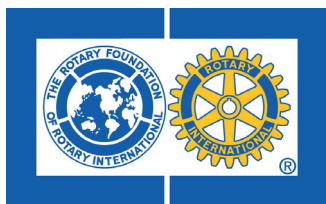
