3 new Doggie Stations were installed and 2 diaper stations in the restrooms. We reviewed plans for the second picnic shelter and laid it out on the ground so we could see how it would fit in. Marc Hult has drawn up a proposed plans for a hexagonal shelter. It would be approximately 45 feet in diameter. Your committee will be meeting this Monday night to review those plans and hopefully approve a design. It appears that we will be able to also expand the existing parking lot at the same time as this might be built. This is the last piece for completion of the park as envisioned back in 2003-04.

Joe and Teri St. Jean, and Susan Albert, want to thank all the participants. It is your support that has allowed our Foundation to fund important projects throughout our valley.








