### THE RESULTS ARE IN

We have finally got a number for you. It appears that the net amount we received from our recent auction came in at **\$95,925** after the payment of all expenses. The gross proceeds were \$115,806.00. After paying the amounts committed to the Women's Resource Center \$30,000, Interact Habitat Build \$10,000, the Wells House \$3,000, Pybus Foundation \$2,500, WestSide High School \$2,500 and the Wenatchee Rotary Foundation \$5,000 for scholarships, we still have \$32,925 for other charitable causes left in our foundation as they become identified.

## The Week in Review -

Tomoko Kaneko, our Japanese exchange student from 10 years ago is visiting & staying with the DeRocks. She currently is living & working in Tokyo. She will be here until next Wednesday.

Bryan Campbell introduced our program. Alfonso Lopez is the principal of Lewis & Clark Elementary where we have the lunch buddy program. Alfonso gave us a little background on himself. He was born & raised in Mexico. As a youth he had to walk 6+ miles one way to school each day. Eventually he got a bike which made the trip much easier. He holds 2 masters degrees, one in Social Studies and one in Language Arts. Alfonso says like has been very generous to him & he is now enjoying giving back to the community. A lunch Buddy can make a difference in the life of a child. These kids are our future and we need to work with them & prepare them the best way we can. The Lunch Buddy program started 25 years ago and has been a success at Lewis & Clark. Who needs a Lunch Buddy: 1. The need for a positive adult role model in their life, 2. Maybe there are some learning issues with certain classes and tutoring can help, 3. Some kids have no significant adult in their life & a Lunch Buddy can help give direction to these kids. The Lunch Buddies are another resource to these kids and it is a rewarding relationship for all. Students learn about responsibility, honesty and trust issues. Alfonso brought Eusebio Suarez whose Lunch Buddy is Earl Tilly. Eusebio talked how great the program has been for him. He doesn't get in trouble anymore and he likes school and learning.

What is the time commitment? 1 or 2 times per week during lunch & recess. Lunch is 15 minutes and recess is 25 minutes for a total of 40 minutes. You can bring your own lunch or buy lunch at the school for \$3. The program culminates with a 5th grade field trip to the Pacific Science Center in Seattle, usually in April. If you want to be a Lunch Buddy call Belia Sanchez at Lewis & Clark and she can help get you started. The students are from 2nd to 5th grade. Currently there are 11 Lunch Buddies & they have needs for up to 25 more.

District 5060 has informed us that the District Grant request for \$10,175.25 in technology upgrade for the WRC has been awarded. The district will pay \$5000.88 and Wenatchee Rotary will match that from the auction funds. The technology upgrade will permit the WRC 2 + 9 computers monitors keyboards and software plus backup files for the staff offices and low income housing community rooms. The grant also pays for wiring cabling security software and access to Local Tel Networks. The grant was written by Laura Turner and Jim Russell.
