Up to 20 high school students from across Canada, North Western United States, Australia and Scotland convene for a 5 day experience within the beautiful Canadian Okanogan Valley.

This program has been in operation for 9 years and has engaged several hundred high school students in increasing their understanding and appreciation for the value tourism represents to our communities. The program promotes an understanding of the vocational opportunities present within this growing and important industry. AIT exposes students to the inner workings of this industry, how they function and why they are integral parts of our communities.

Tourism is an important and significant part of the GDP in Canada and the United States. The visitor economy drives key service industries, including accommodations, food and beverage, passenger transportation, recreation and entertainment. In Canada those services account of over 9 percent of the total employment.
