Tom Auvil graduated from Eastmont High School in 1974, attended Wenatchee Valley College for two years, transfering to Washington State University and graduated in 1978 with a degree in Horticulture. Tom has operated a small family orchard of 50 acres since 1974 – 42nd crop in production, He worked at Trout, Inc in Chelan from 1979 to 1999 as production consultant/fieldstaff manager and quality control Manager. Tom joined Washington Tree Fruit Research Commission in 2000 and is currently project manager evaluating rootstock and scion varieties of apples, pears, and cherries.

He is has been an Orondo School director from 1986 to 2000, TreeTop director since 1988, North Central Washington Fieldman's Association since 1979 and current president, International Fruit Tree Association member since 1985, member of research committee since 1995, and board member 1995 to 2004.

Kate Evans is a Professor in the Department of Horticulture at WSU, based here in Wenatchee at the Tree Fruit Research and Extension Center. She has managed WSU's pome fruit breeding programs since she arrived at WSU in 2008. Previously she managed an internationally funded apple and pear breeding program at East Malling Research in the Uk for 16 years. She has 4 kids who are in the Wenatchee School District (2 at WHS (senior and junior), 1 at Foothills (8th) and 1 at Lewis and Clark Elementary(5th). 

FEBRUARY BIRTHDAYS

February is the birthday month for Rotary.

Rotary was 111 years on February 23. On this day in 1905 Paul Harris formed one of the world's first service organizations, the Rotary Club of Chicago, as a place where professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas and form meaningful, lifelong friendships. Today we have over 35,000 clubs with over 1,200,000 members. These numbers do not even begin to count the Interacters, Rotaracters and the RCCS's which number another 800,000 members. The Polio Plus campaign started just 31 year ago in February, 1985. Since that time over 2 billion children have been saved from lifelong paralysis. Last year we only had 70 cases of the wild polio virus and those were contained in only two countries, Pakistan and Afghanistan.

AND on February 1st, 1921 or our Wenatchee Rotary club was chartered with 25 charter members and in that first year added 30 new members. That same year our weekly publication the "Appleseed" was germinated. Both the Club and our Appleseed are celebrating their 95th birthdays this month.


