What is a classification in Rotary?

Rotary membership is based on the principle that Rotarians represent as many of the business, professional and institutional life of the local community in which the club is established. The classification of each active member shall be that which covers the principal and recognized activity of the firm, company, or institution with which he or she is connected, or if independently engaged in a business or profession, the classification shall be that which covers the principal and recognized business or professional activity. The plan contemplates that a Rotary club will have an active membership which will be so diversified that ultimately every worthy and recognized phase of business, professional, and institutional life in the locality will be represented in the club. It should be clearly understood that classifications are determined by activities or services to society rather than by the position held by a particular individual.

Classification Talks are designed to allow an individual member to tell us a little about their profession and themselves. All designed for our membership to get to know them a little better and for them to feel more comfortable with the rest of the membership.

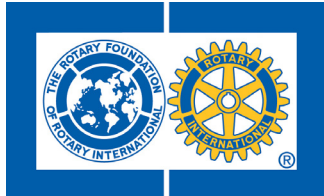
