The Week in Review –

(4) **Fun & humor** Don hopes we can do things which provide more ways for fun, such as “Firesides”; **Bryan Campbell** gave details of a recent one . Brags protocol will be more fun as we brag about others and receive a gift. **Rich Peters** will be Bragmaster.


