"Presidential Inauguration" With Jim Russell

Jesus Hernandez. I want to honor Jesus as past president for Wenatchee Rotary particularly because of his belief about service and his commitment to live up to that belief. We have heard a lot of praise for Jesus, but I want to emphasize what I've heard him say time and time again: "This is your community, take responsibility for it." He's lived it as servant in the Wenatchee Valley, in Washington and Wenatchee Rotary as he brought in new members, "This is your community, take responsibility for it." He is an inspiration for me and for all of us.

Bill Murray. I want to honor Bill because he served as Rotary President under the threat of the big C cancer. Recently he was declared cancer free after ten years. But you may not know his struggle included ordinary and extraordinary chemotherapy and radiation treatment that failed, making his desperate condition acceptable to be the second person in Washington to undergo immunotherapy. While he has thrived, accepting the presidency was a threat to his life. The amount of chemo and radiation treatment he received left potentially lethal residues that could create more cancers, especially if agitated by stress and exhaustion. Courageously accepted the presidency and I heard him say recently, "I didn't know if had the strength, and his first goal was to survive." He is heroic and he is unquestionably a magnificent gift to the Wenatchee Rotary Club, to the community and to the world.

Our club is a member of Rotary International and at the Rotary convention in Seoul I was thrilled to watch the parade of 182 flags representing all but a nine of the 191 nations in the United Nations Charter. Each of those flags indicated that individuals lived every day with local Rotarians bound to the pledge to provide service above self, first in their local communities and second to the whole world. I've always been impressed with Olympians who strive to perform for a few weeks every 4 years. Think of Rotarians as individuals on an international team every day, every year serving local communities in 182 nations. I was profoundly honored to be representing you as a Rotarian.

At a training I learned you and I as Rotarians belong to the Wenatchee Rotary Club. We don't belong to Rotary International. Our club belongs to Rotary International. The District and Rotary International can't tell our Club what to do or set goals. The District and RI provide the organizational structure and resources like the Rotary Foundation but we are the individuals who make it happen.

And as individuals we are united with other Rotarians around the world. In Seoul I was on the elevator when a man from Nigeria wearing his native robe rushed onto the elevator pulling his suitcase and leaned against the back wall. He'd traveled across two continents. I smiled and welcomed him as a fellow Rotarian. He pushed himself off the wall and wrapped his arms around me. That Rotarian and his club have undoubtedly contributed to the Rotary Foundation and because their donations were united with our donations to generate more income, he and his club contributed to our grant for the Women's Resource Center.

Rotary International and the Rotary Foundation make us one of the most effective and frugal service clubs serving the most dismal regions on this planet. The Rotary Foundation is ranked fifth among all similar international foundations based on expenses and service. Our Wenatchee Rotary Foundation is the envy of many other clubs in our District. Wenatchee Rotary began in 1921 and thrived over the past year, including growing membership.

This coming year I ask you to make two commitments to Wenatchee Rotary. The first commitment is exemplified by Jesus, "This is your club, take responsibility for it." The second commitment is exemplified by Bill Murray: "Be a gift to this Wenatchee Rotary Club."

If each of us keeps those commitments we will fulfill the Presidential theme this year, Rotary Serving Humanity. We will be a better club, a bigger club and a bolder club. Wenatchee Rotary can be better, bigger and bolder.


