PE Don introduced our speaker Jimmy Crocker, franchise owner of three local Dutch Bros Coffee stands. Jimmy told us that it was actually started in Oregon in 1992 by two Dutch Brothers, Dane and Trav. They were searching for a business opportunity and were motivated by Tony Robbins, a marketing advocate, businessman and author. They settled on coffee, but more importantly, created a business that was fun and part of the community. Jimmy, whose only business experience was working in delis, knew Dane who in 2002 gave him a chance to get into the coffee business and learn who he really was. He parlayed this into a thriving business today with three locations employing some 60 to 70 employees. His business model isn't about maximizing coffee sales, it's all about the treatment of people, employees and their customers.

Dutch Bros Coffee donates over \$2,000,000 a year to local communities and nonprofit organizations and Jimmy's franchise follows that theme. Most recently they raised money in the "Campaign for Erik", helping with medical and family expenses associated with this local young man's critical heart transplant.

For this and probably many more reasons, the Chamber of Commerce awarded our local Dutch Bros coffee the Business of the Year.
