Congress adopted the Stars and Stripes as the American flag on June 14, 1777. • The colors of the flag have important meanings. Red symbolizes hardiness and valor; white symbolizes purity and innocence and blue represents vigilance, perseverance and justice. • The first Flag Day observance was on June 14, 1885, when 19-year-old school teacher Bernard J. Cigrand placed a 38-inch star flag in a bottle on his desk. He assigned essays about the flag and its significance. • On August 3, 1949, President Truman signed an Act of Congress that would designate June 14 of each year as National Flag Day. • The American flag is a source of pride and inspiration for American citizens, especially today and on other patriotic holidays like the Fourth of July. It encourages us to play a part in our community and give back to those who need it.

Each club member in good standing is also a member of the Foundation.

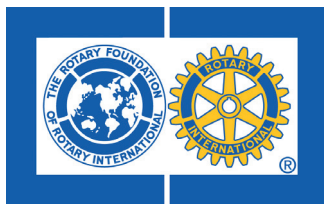
