The Week in Review -

Our program this week featured speakers who told us a little about what is being done in the Mental Health Arena in North Central Washington. It turns out that Catholic Family & Child Services is playing a large role in working with the mentally ill in our area. They are if you will a first responder when someone is seeking help. Carolina Venn-Padilla explained their role in the community. They started working with clients in January of 2014 and in April of this year contracted with the North Central Behavioral Health Organization. They currently work with between 625-650 clients. They provide adult and children therapy, Therapy Groups, Case Management, Day Support, and Medication Management. In addition to these services they also provide services related to chemical dependency and crisis intervention.

We learned that people don't really want to die but want the pain and suffering they feel to go away. It is in how you deal with it. They have helped with the Suicide Prevention Lifeline.

Their services are open to anyone in the community regardless of religion, or financial ability to pay. Their walk-in clinic is located at 701 North Miller or you can call 24/7 at 1-800-852-2923. "Their mission is motivated by Christ's love, to bring hope to life, especially to those most in need." They envision communities where people are treated with dignity and respect, their basic needs are met, and they are empowered to enhance the quality of their own lives.

One of their greatest challenges is finding housing for these people so that they don't become part of the homeless population.

Linda Parlette was also there and reiterated that the state is trying to provide funding non only for the homeless and also for mental health medical help. They recognize a shortage of providers will take time and funding. It takes the cooperation of the legislature, law enforcement, the courts, the medical community, charities and mental health providers to make it work. Lots of questions. A very informative program.
