

ROTARY AUCTION FUNDS AT WORK:

The Wells House Committee held its annual Spring Tea on May 14. The sold-out event was popular with the attendees, who were dressed in “Downton Abbey” era attire.

The Wells House is located on the campus of Wenatchee Valley College and holds an important place in the history of our valley. It was constructed by W.T. Clark in 1909. Mr. Clark designed and constructed the Highline Irrigation Canal, the siphon tube crossing the Wenatchee River, and the bridge that carries the Highline water to East Wenatchee. The Wells House was purchased by A.Z. Wells (of Wells and Wade fame) in 1919 and was deeded to the Wenatchee School District in 1949 to start the then Wenatchee Junior College. It served as the first classroom and administrative building. The Wells House Committee is committed to restoring and preserving this impressive structure.

The Wells House was the worthy recipient of a portion of our Wenatchee Rotary Foundation auction proceeds. Shown is Kris Bassett, President of the Wells House Committee, receiving a check for \$3,000 from Joe St.Jean, representing Wenatchee Rotary Foundation. The money will help the committee replace the wooden roof covering the stone outdoor cooking and eating area. The structure is being designed to enhance the historic look and feel of the house. Stay tuned for further details of how our Rotary Club can be involved in the completion of this worthwhile project.


