

Second, we will enjoy a tasty meal provided by Mike's Meats, a Pybus retailer. The Entiat Hot Shots are one of 109 hot shot teams under the jurisdiction of the Forest Service. This 20 member, wildland fire fighting crew is hosted at the Entiat Ranger Station. These specially trained, elite teams provide exceptional firefighting in an ever changing hostile environment. Like the Seahawks, special emphasis is placed on teamwork and crew pride. Their difficult living conditions, arduous work and need for rapid response breed an atmosphere of camaraderie and adventure.
