The first St. Patrick's Day parade took place in the United States on March 17, 1762, when Irish soldiers serving in the English military marched through New York City. - More than 100 St. Patrick's Day parades are held across the United States. New York City, (Each year, between 150,000 and 250,000 marchers take part in the parade, which does not allow automobiles or floats) and Boston are home to the largest celebrations. There are 34.7 million U.S. residents with Irish ancestry. This number is more than seven times the population of Ireland itself. - There are approximately 144,588 current U.S. residents who were born in Ireland. - Corned beef and cabbage is a traditional St. Patrick's Day dish. In 2009, roughly 26.1 billion pounds of beef and 2.3 billion pounds of cabbage were produced in the United States.

The Week in Review -

PRESIDING OFFICER AND REMARKS : President Jim Russell opened the meeting as usual with guest introductions and announcements for fundraisers.. One local Rotary guest was Kathleen McNalty of Sunrise, promoting their annual bike-ride fundraiser in June.

President Jim gave an inspiring introduction for our excellent speaker who made a supreme sacrifice to be with us, Past District Governor (PDG Pete Erickson). SUMMARY OF PROGRAM : PDG Pete Erickson

Pete thanked Jim for the introduction declaring that of all the introductions he ever received, this was the most recent! He then proceeded to relate an interesting personal experience many years ago which drove him to get involved with the Rotary International Foundation (TRF). He then explained his great appreciation for the Foundation and its great work.

He discussed why we join Rotary and what Rotary has accomplished, especially through TRF, its charity arm, of which he detailed some of the highlights of its history, beginning in 1917 with Arch Klumph. He referred us to the annual TRF Report, which is available on line. He lauded Dr. Ed Cadman for his key role in launching Polio Plus in 1985. He related how TRF has the highest possible rating for a foundation as determined by Charity Navigator.

Pete gave some shocking statistics about conditions of people around the world as evidence for the importance of the work done internationally by TRF. "America's societal issues are "dwarfed" by those in many other countries".

In this centennial year for TRF, we have an excellent opportunity to make a significant impact on the capability of TRF through our District 5060 Million Dollar Dinner event April 7. Its purpose is to :

- 1. Raise one million dollars above normal giving
- 2. Celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Foundation

3. Celebrate the legacy of Dr. Ed Cadman (former club and international president)

4. Honor Dr. Cadman with a special tribute fund.

He explained the criteria for honorary attendance at the event, which is to donate, bequeath, or commit to \$10,000 USD or more this year, and that other Rotarians may attend via \$50 ticket purchase (all registrations may be done through a link on our club web site which has event details).

The final program segment was recognition of club members who have made donations this year toward Paul Harris Fellowships (which requires a cumulative contribution of \$1000 to TRF).and/or reached multiple PHF levels.

Details will be listed in a future Appleseed.

- Five members achieving a new PHF multiple level
- Four new major donors and/or Bequest Society members.

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
