Photos, Letters, and Stories of a WWII Medical Officer LT. COL. ARTHUR L. LUDWICK JR, M.D.: 1941 – 1944

Iowa National Guard, Northern Ireland, North Africa, Italy

Growing up I knew my father as a quiet, modest, conservative and disciplined man with a dry sense of humor who was, above all, a devoted physician, husband, and father. He was the consummate storyteller and archivist – history and details mattered to him and he saved everything. Through interviews over the last few years of his life, supplemented by his captioned photos and over 270 typed/detailed letters from the front lines of WWII, I discovered my father the man, and the foundation for his definition of success: "...doing something you don't want to do, and doing it well."

Everyone sat at tables with their procurement team members to discuss auction details.

Program was Chelan County PUD General Manager Steve Wright with his classification talk. Steve was introduced by Tracey Yount from the PUD and also a member of our club. Steve came to Wenatchee in 2013 after he retired from the Bonneville Power Administration as their chief. Steve spent 16 years with BPA, the last 12 as the administrator. Steve was born in Lexington, Kentucky. His family moved around the country a lot. He graduated from High School in Detroit, Michigan and then went to the University of Oregon, earning a master's degree in Public Administration. Steve is a believer in education and making the most of your education to help others. He originally wanted to be a sportswriter but changed his mind toward public admin so he could help bring about changes in people's lives. Since coming to the PUD Steve has pushed an agenda of investing in assets and people, reducing debt & working on public power benefit programs. So how are things going? The assets of the PUD are in worse shape than originally thought. The price of power is coming down but currently all is well with the PUD. 2016 should show \$75M in profit. The PUD is rethinking their strategies about long term debt and continuing to look over the horizon for opportunities and threats. Steve's mantra is the best value for the most people for the longest period of time.

Steve is married to Kathleen McNalty and they have 2 adopted Korean children. The PUD is in good hands with someone of Steve's experience and work ethic running their programs.

Gary Provo gave us an auction update. The committee is asking every member to procure 2 items and bring in a bottle of wine.
