## The Week in Review -

President-Elect Pete Van Well presided in place of President Don who was away, referring to our club as the 12th man of service clubs. He first called on club chaplain Paul Pankey to deliver a prayer on behalf of local fire fighters and those dealing with severe weather and added that the Rotary Foundation has a fund to assist SE storm victims (info will be on our web site). Pete also remembered the passing of log-time faithful Rotarian (36 years in our club) Lloyd Berry, who passed away this week on his 80th birthday. Numerous guests included our two new exchange students, and the sister and son of Barbara Walters, being inducted today. Gil Sparks then introduced Barbara for induction as a new member; Ford Barrett gave the charge and Dick Reed will be her mentor. Ford implored the members to make her feel welcome. Pete's word of the week, indeed the century: thankful. Gil Sparks led an auction of Susan Albert's donated Kelowna condo, purchased by Sue Rose for \$425, all going the foundation. Gil then introduced the program speakers Kim and Courtney.

Program highlights. Gil Sparks presented Kim Neher and Courtney Tiffany, staff from North Central Regional Library system, who used an interactive approach to describe many things that our local library has to offer and some of the exciting changes in store. We learned that the Wenatchee library each month sees over 22,000 visits and lends between 35-40,000 items, and over 7,100 public computer unique logins. It has 28 regular monthly storytime programs (not including other engaging things like Trivia Night, 3D Printing classes, book clubs, lecturers, Summer Reading programs, and other special events). Libraries are not dying! Most core services will always remain the same - but your library is more than its books. "Our services have changed to meet the needs of our community - and it's time for our building to change, too."We were told about the current expansion, triggered by a 2013 generous donation by Jim Wade, which allowed an expansion and major improvements to what is now the Camille Wade Children's Library, which led to nearly 10% increase in useage.

With a desire to bring the rest of the library up to the new standard of the children's room, a survey of the public led to new planning. A PowerPoint was used to show some of the current planning for the \$1.5 million renovation. The "Friends of the Wenatchee Library" has already raised over half of that amount, with over \$840K in gifts and pledges. As fundraising efforts progress with grant applications, they need to show a broad base of the community support. Donations of any size can be made on the campaign website (wplcampaign.org); volunteers are needed to help with the efforts.

The Wenatchee Public Library is the largest of 30 libraries in the North Central Regional Library System. NCRL covers five counties of more than 14,000 square miles with a population of over 250,000! It is governed by a board of seven people appointed by our county commissioners, and funded through property taxes. NCRL offers bookmobile service, a mail order library, a book club library, outreach services, and much more, including materials and staff in all sites. Anyone with a library card has access to over 700,000 items, more than half million ebooks and downloadable audiobook titles with OverDrive, Hoopla, and RBDigital and access to 28 subscription resources accessible from the website, like Rosetta Stone, Consumer Reports, The New York Times, and streaming movies and TV shows with Hoopla.

Library card applications were provided to those interested and cards made on the spot.
