## The Week in Review -

President Don opened with the fact that September 19 was the first annual Adam West Day in Walla Walla.

On a somber note, former-member Chuck Jinneman's wife Joan passed away this week. A service is planned for Monday 11 AM at St. Joseph's.

Program - "Conflict Resolution." Susan Albert sponsored and introduced our speakers, long time friends of hers, Diana Hernandez and Steve Schwinn (past pres. Leavenworth Rotary) with Wenatchee Valley Dispute Resolution Center (www.wvdrc.org).

Dispute resolution involves alternate and appropriate methods of conflict resolution as opposed to legal court.

Diana referred to the book "The Sacred Art of Listening" by Kay Lindahl, which declares good listening is one of the best gifts we can give to others. She discussed perspectives on 3 important words as they apply to mediation, first giving the members time to ponder their own definitions.

ISSUES - "The What" the presenting problem or symptom, tip of iceberg;

POSITIONS "The How" how the client wants the issue resolved;

INTERESTS – "The Why", the iceberg below, deep-seated needs (emotional).

Mediation can be used to resolve almost any type dispute, such as divorce, parenting, neighborhood, employment, consumer, landlord/tenant, with advantages of being faster and less costly, offering greater participation, more control of outcome, more flexible, less formal, confidential and private.

The private structured process uses a trained certified neutral third party to help the clients discuss issues and concerns, and reach a settlement agreement that is "do-able and durable". This can usually happen in a 3-hour session. Steve cited the process as rewarding, positive and energizing for all involved. It is a more warm/fuzzy process than court settlements. Some courts mandate mediation They get most client referrals from attorneys, but clients must agree in advance to agree to the process. There is a very high success rate, taking much burden off the court system, leading to many court cases without the need for representation. Each third Friday, they are available at Small Claims Court. Mediation works because each party involved is fully heard and their concerns and needs are met and addressed through the settlement agreement they reach. It is their own agreement, not one created or imposed by others.

Fees are set on a sliding scale, and run between \$25-150. There are 8 trained mediators available, and a training session is scheduled for October 9.

#### **END POLIO NOW**

Last year, our goal for the PolioPlus/Club 60 was \$3000.00, equivalent to \$9,000 or 15,000 lives saved when taking into account the Gates Foundation 2 for 1 match (being extended for 3 more years). Our goal this year is increased to \$4,000 through the cups and other fundraisers, equivalent to 20,000 lives saved.

The amount raised over the 10 weeks of this Rotary year = \$380 (\$1140 with match), or 1900 lives saved.


