John Kottkamp spent a year in Central Belgium. During the year he had 2 host families. He attended a school of 3,000 students from elementary through high school. John said his duties were to attend class and not cause any problems. During his year they took side trips to Paris, Berlin and to Legoland in Denmark. There were 3 other exchange students in his high school class. He now has lots of new friends and enjoyed the best year of his life. John will be attending Western this fall hoping to major in history & become a teacher.

Isabel Pelayo, as a first alternate, was sponsored by Quincy Rotary and spent her year in Zurich, Switzerland. She also had 2 host families. She went to the equivalent of 9th grade. She took 12 subjects including English, Spanish & German plus math, science, history, etc. She said her school was hard but enjoyable. Her school started at 7:25 AM and ended between 3 & 5 every day. She also played on 3 different soccer teams and skied. She especially enjoyed having sisters as she has 2 brothers at home. During her year she visited 11 different countries. The students were asked about their biggest surprise: John - eating is different, more formal & slower. Isabel - the transportation system is wonderful, easy to navigate; it goes everywhere.

They were also asked when they felt comfortable in their new language. John – 5 months before he was confident in his French. Isabel – it was with her 2nd host family as her first host family spoke mostly English at home.
