Program: Classification talks by Tyler Mickey and David Olson

Tyler Mickey, CPA. Born in Wenatchee to a family who originally settled here in 1908, Tyler, a CPA for Moss Adams, joined our Rotary club on Dec 1. His journey to stand before us, where he once stood as a student, took him first from Wenatchee High School to the University of Washington, where he studied accounting and received his master's degree in taxation. After graduating in September 1996, he joined PricewaterhouseCoopers, where he worked in various roles for 20 years with a diverse mix of people from around the world, including Asia and Africa. Between 1998 and 2005, Tyler was a member of the University Sunrise Rotary, which possibly led to the best information of all: Make up meetings by the Fremont Fun Club are available at Hale's Ale in Seattle on Tuesdays. Last October, he joined Moss Adams, the nation's 15th largest accounting firm where he considers himself a "quarterback" of advising teams, which usually include attorneys and financial advisors as well.

His wife, Anna, was a Rotary exchange student from this club from 1991 to 1992, graduating from the UW with a business degree. They have

three children. Tyler used to ski but now enjoys reading even more, and he is a member of the Seattle Public Library Board. When asked (because of his name), he admitted that he and his family are "Disney addicts", having visited a resort or taken a cruise at least 12 times since 2006.

David Olson, MHA

At a young age, **David Olson** was told, "You have a purpose in life – to make the world a better place." Taking this to heart, he began to look for careers in medicine but soon realized that with an aversion to the sight of blood, being a doctor was not for him. However, that led him to consider health administration, so he left his childhood home in Washington, D.C., and sought one of the few programs that offered a B.A. in Business with a concentration in Health Administration at Walla Walla University. He continued his studies at the UW, studying both business and hospital management, and literally spending his days from one end of campus to the other. After graduation, he returned home seeking to find the answer to every recent grad's question of what's next. He met with the husband of his fourth grade teacher who happened to have done very well as a hospital administrator and decided this is a role he could play.

His first jobs were in Los Angeles and later Arizona. Realizing "the best part was working with the doctors," he moved to Charleston, S.C., to refocus his career as a medical CEO. But after a few years, he and his wife missed the West Coast, so they moved to the Blue Mountain Medical Group in Walla Walla. Shortly after, the administrator retired in Moses Lake, so he took that position. Last year, he became the CEO at Columbia Valley Community Health. His job entails many aspects, including humility, listening, finance, advocacy, medical knowledge "by osmosis", politics and improvisation. "Visioneering," he said, involves "helping make a vision into reality." For example, one goal of his job is "every school has one of our providers there every day, helping kids."

He and his wife Laura have been married 27 years and have two daughters. Previously a Moses Lake Rotarian, he joined in 2000 because his goal of making the world a better place is a good fit.
