The Week in Review -

President Don Meyers opened a Veterans Day program by inviting Mike Kintner to lead members and guests in a two patriotic songs; "My Country Tis of Thee" and "God Bless America".

Guests were introduced, several of which were Vets who came to listen to todays' program.

President Don Meyers inducted Joel Lhamon into Downtown Rotary. Joel is sponsored by Al Bridges and Tom McNair was named to be Joel's mentor. A charge will be given at a future meeting.

Thank you to Ford Barrett for inviting our guest speaker and for coordinating todays' program. Ford asked all Veterans to stand, followed by all who have had a Veteran in the family showing us that everyone has served in one way or another. Ford then introduced AF Colonel Marshall Groves from Fairchild AF base near Spokane.

Colonel Grove leads a survival school called SERE, Survival, Escape, Resistance and Evasion, which trains military to return with honor, including how to behave if captured. The United States is unique in that it lets its' military know that we care enough to provide this training and we will come get you.

WA sate is a unique location, because trainees can fly within 3 hours and be in any climate from dessert, arctic, tropics, coastal. Colonel Grove Proceeded to tell a harrowing story of his own experience in 2004 when deployed as a helicopter pilot near Fallujah, Iraq. Flying in pairs, they encountered an ambush by a group of insurgents armed with rocket propelled grenades. One of the rockets hit the cockpit of the lead helicopter. As the reporter, I cannot find meaningful words to describe the humbling story of brotherhood, fear, honor, survival, rescue and patriotism. Our goal this Rotary year is \$4,000 through the cups and other fundraisers, or \$12,000 with the Gates Foundation 2-for-1 match; this amount results in 20,040 lives saved.

Donations by club members on Nov. 9 = \$21, bringing our YTD total to \$2672 (\$8016 with the Gates match, or 13,386.lives saved.

Additionally the amount donated by the public on World Polio Day was \$2675.
