Wenatchee Rotary Auction

The name says it all! This year's Wenatchee Rotary Auction, January 29, 2022 at the Wenatchee Center, is literally "For the Kids!"

Below are brief descriptions of the four worthwhile groups that will receive proceeds from the upcoming fundraiser:



Camp Fire North Central Washington Council

More than 90 years strong, Camp Fire North Central Washington provides quality programs to Chelan, Douglas, Grant and Okanogan county youth. From the early days of Blue Birds and Camp Fire Girls, the organization has grown to include services for both boys and girls. Activities range from camping to school readiness.

The core of Camp Fire NCW has been the Traditional Club Program, where volunteer leaders meet with small groups for informal educational experiences. Recognition awards, in the form of emblems and beads, are earned by completing activities and service projects.

Camp Fire NCW operates Camp Zanika, which provides overnight summer camp, environmental education and group rentals. Established in 1932 on the shores of Lake Wenatchee, the camp is 31 miles west of Leavenworth. The 13-acre camp is a getaway experience for people of all ages.



Chelan Douglas CASA

Recognizing that children in the justice system needed caring adults to be their voices, Seattle juvenile court judge David W. Soukup launched CASA (Court-Appointed Special Advocate) in 1976.

In 1994, a small group of foster parents, committed to furthering the aims and goals of the local foster parent association, sought out Sue Baker for direction and aid in forming a CASA program in Chelan and Douglas counties. Sue had been a CASA volunteer in Seattle before moving to Wenatchee with her family.

Taking up the challenge, Sue worked closely with many in the community, including the then-Superior Court Judge Carol Wardell, to start the Chelan-Douglas CASA program. After more than 25 years, the program continues to grow and boasts nearly 100 volunteers.



Wenatchee Valley YMCA

More than 100 years ago, a group of people met to discuss the needs of boys and young men in Wenatchee and decided the organization of a Young Men's Christian Association could give direction to the leisure time of youth and stimulate the development of Christian character.
