comprehensive projects as it did on those that may be effected in the


near future by donations of \$ and of volunteer time.

The current list of projects:

- A sign for the Richland Rotary Centennial Plaza (as it will be officially known).
- Keene Road travel corridor from Bellerive to Queensgate, with rebuilding of Keene Road, to extend ultimately from Steptoe to West Richland.
- Pawsability Place, a dog park.
- John Dam Plaza. There are four different master plans to consider.



- Winter Wonderland. Lighting displays to be added in a progressive manner.
- Elephant Slide. Volunteers have responded as a result of Herald article. It remains to be determined as to which park and where to place it.
- Park Repurposing projects. Plans are in progress to create a varied atmosphere among them to avoid sameness.
- Hanford Legacy Park at Vantage Highway just beyond Kingsgate. There is to be a 117 acre park with a sports complex with four Babe Ruth fields now being built near Horn Rapids.
- Friends of the Park Foundation.
