
Foreign Exchange Student

Program

One of our own—Richland City Manager Cindy Johnson—provided our program today. Cindy walked the audience through a quiz on their knowledge of the City of Richland. In their recent citizen survey, 87 percent of the respondents said that the services provided by the city were "good" or "excellent."

The city's annual budget is \$250 million, which is much more than any other city in the area, primarily because Richland provides public utilities. The city employs 491 staff members, which is about the same number that they had in 2002. Cindy emphasized that the annual budget is scrutinized carefully each year, line-item by line-



item. The city has finally got to the place where they actually have a baseline budget which has taken a lot of time and effort. There will not be a property tax increase, although there was an increase in electric utility increase on January 1.

Richland works with Kennewick and Pasco on how to control the costs of services. The city has \$296,000 set aside to stabilize the city's general fund in case the economic recovery takes longer than expected in addition to the 7.5 percent city reserve.

In 2013 the city will have a task group look at funding strategies for some of their major initiatives. These include: the Duportail Bridge, a new fire station in South Richland, Hanford Legacy Park, the joint animal control facility, Swift corridor improvements, financial system replacement, smartgrid broadband improvement, Keene Road Trail improvements, and land fill improvements.

The city faces a number of potential vulnerabilities looking out to the future. These include:

increased jail costs, increased district court costs, solid waste management, and needed capital improvements. This would not be possible without developing and paying attention to. Richland wants to be the "go to city," the city others go to in order to find out how something is successfully done. Sounds like the city is well on its way to achieving that goal! Thanks for everything you do for all of us, Cindy.
