### Program

Julie Funfar introduced today's speaker, Candace Andrews, Artistic Director of the Valley Theater Company. They own and operate the Princess Theater in Prosser. Ms. Andrews has been involved with the Valley Theater Company for many years as a performer, Board President and at the theater as a dresser, set designer, prop coordinator, you name it. She was also the City of Richland Public Information Officer a while back.

The Valley Theater Company was founded in 1961 as the Lower Valley Musical Comedy Company. They started with Annie, and did one production each year at the high school. They started in 2000 doing some non-musical productions with the current name. The moved to the Princess Theater in 2007 and began a program of 4 productions each year. They were asked to manage the theater in 2009 and purchased it in 2013.





The Princess Theater was built in 1920. It drew people from a wide area for boxing matches and vaudeville shows. It was damaged by fire in 1946 and turned into a movie theater. That continued until the late 70s when it closed. The Mercer family bought it in 2005 and reopened it in 2007, when the Valley Theater Company started doing its productions there. The theater has a restored stage and drop down movie screen, seating 260 people. The other side of the building is the Green Room, once a restaurant, now available for events such as meetings and receptions.

The Valley Theater Company has a Board of Directors more oriented now to the business of owning and operating the Princess. They have a part-time Theater Manager who manages and maintains the building and facilities. The Artistic Director is responsible for the four productions done each year. They want to grow the venue

and use it for other events as an Arts center. They do already host a number of events and want to do more children's events.

They have some work to do; they need a full commercial kitchen for the Green room, better wardrobe and costume storage, dressing rooms and a place to build sets. They are looking at a vacant lot next door to purchase and build a shop. They are seeking grants, and are on the list for a Washington State Heritage Capital Projects fund grant of \$15,000. They are also developing other fundraising efforts.

The next production by the group is a comedy called the Lone Star Love Potion (PG-13 rated). It starts February 12. They will be showing the movie Saving Faith, a faith-based romance on February 4. Later this spring is a production of Painting Churches, a drama. Look for it in late April.

They have also made some progress on a Beer Wagon as a fundraising item.
