# **Program**

Today's program was the Washington Department of Ecology's Ron Skinnarland, who provided the club with an excitingly-detailed description of the agency's 4 ½-foot thick, 14,000-page, Dangerous Waste Permit for the Hanford site.

The Public Comment period on the new document is starting soon and will end in September. Ron provided background on the development of conditions that led to the Tri-Party agreement in 1989. The Permit set conditions based on the state's laws and regulations that control the treatment, storage and disposal of dangerous hazardous wastes.



The primary purpose of the Permit, of course, is the protection of human health and the environment. The challenge is to clean up about 70 square miles of contaminated groundwater, 56 million gallons of radioactive and chemical wastes in underground tanks, hundreds of contaminated buildings, hundreds of contaminated soil sites, and millions of tons of contaminated soil.

The Permit covers the treatment, storage, and disposal of dangerous (chemically hazardous) wastes, mixed wastes (both radioactive and chemically hazardous), that are found across the entire Hanford Site. It does not cover solely radioactive materials or Superfund sites. The Permit is a "living" permit. It was first issued in 1994 and has been modified: many times. It is required to be reissued every 10 years. It covers operating units like the Waste Treatment Plant, closure such as the tank farms, and post closure units, like the process trenches in the 300 area.
