The first was DeWayne Halstad who is the officer in charge of the local branch of the Salvation Army. DeWayne has been a Rotarian for 11 years and has been posted to La Grande, Oregon; Butte, Montana, and Centralia, Washington. He and his wife moved to Richland last year.







The Salvation Army is one of America's foremost leaders in social services. They help hundreds of thousands each year by helping them with seasonal assistance, monthly food boxes, utility and rental assistance payments so that people can stay in their homes. Each year, they help people with alcohol and drug abuse at their adult rehabilitation centers throughout the U.S. They offer youth programs for kids 6 to 16 years old. The Salvation Army is also well-known for its work in disaster relief. They've been in Richland since 1983 and in Pasco for more than 100 years. DeWayne and his wife are delighted to be here and a member of our community.

Next was Tom Huntington, Richland's Fire Chief, who put a carefully crafted Power Point presentation together but, unfortunately, we didn't have a computer today. Unfazed, Tom provided us with a great verbal presentation without notes. Tom and his wife met at Eastern Washington University and they have lived in Richland since 1994 - 23years. He has two teenage daughters, one is a taxidermist and another is at Delta pursuing a career in cybersecurity.

Tom is an ordained Deacon in the Catholic Church. In his off-time, he works with young adults on career counselling and other needs. Tom believes that Richland is the best fire department in the Western U.S. In 2016 they have 54 firefighters and handled 6,500 calls. They were able to do that because of technology and cooperation with other emergency services. They provide fire response, emergency medical, and hazardous materials response. Tom is preparing his department for the next ten years. He has asked his department to be "community-driven, customer-focused, and competition ready."

Finally, we heard from Chris Meyers, the vice chancellor for student affairs at WSU Tri-Cities who began with, "I don't know how you follow up after a fireman and a church leader!" Chris said that Richland Rotary has been a wonderful source of help for their campus. He spoke about his job. "Nobody grows up wanting to be a vice chancellor for student affairs." Chris attended Fort Hayes State University in Kansas where he was a pre-med student. He became a graduate assistant in the office of student affairs and went on to make it his career. They make sure that their students are as successful at whatever they do. They are also an advocate for their



students. Chris provided a background of the genesis of student affairs profession since the mid-1950s. Common activities include the Registrar's office, financial aid, student life and activities, and wrap-around support services for students, like personal and mental health counselling. Today, their primary focus is to support and advocate for their students. He said that you get to see individual's lives change.

WSU Tri-Cities has a record enrollment for the fourth year in a row. They serve a lot of first generation students. He said that it was a privilege and honor both to be associated with a school like WSU Tri-Cities but also our community.
