Program

Our program was provided by Lt. Col. Timothy Vail, commander of the Walla Walla District of the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers. Col. Vail joined the army in 1997 and has had a distinguished career, including deployments in Korea, Kuwait, and numerous Gulf States. He has advanced degrees from Notre Dame, Missouri University of Science and Technology and Texas A&M.

Col. Vail described the mission of the Walla Walla District which includes dams on the Snake and Columbia Rivers, dredging, levee maintenance, the preservation of fish species, outdoor recreation, and emergency preparedness. He



oversees a \$210 million annual budget and provides \$800 million worth of electricity.

He answered questions about current issues including the Lower Snake River dams, land transfers to local communities, planning for earthquakes and natural disasters, and fish management under the Columbia River Treaty.
