- The pageant is much more than parading across a stage. The events include an interview, on-stage talent, swimsuit, and evening wear.
- Jerrica enjoys helping young people with building their confidence to enable the realization of their dreams and making their own decisions. In her mentoring capacity, she has been able to rescue a few from trouble.
- She mentions mentoring in such places as the YMCA and Boys & Girls Clubs as areas in which trusted, non-judgmental adults provide valuable help.
