The Three Rivers Children's Museum

Perhaps we knew that play is essential for children, but were unaware of how vital it is. And if the truth were known, most adults have not completely shed the inclination to play. The results of interaction between kids and trusted adults are statistically and favorably significant. With the above principles presented, Teri Andre's discussion of the Three Rivers Children's Museum (henceforth TRCM) proceeded.

- It is a 501(c)(3) non-profit educational foundation.
- After several moves, it is located presently at the Broadmoor Mall in a 3000 sq. ft. facility.
- The focus is on the 2-8 year age group. Parents, grandparents, and significant adults play with the kids.
- Studies show that children who play interactively with adults do better in later life than others do.
- There are 23 such museums in the northwest.
 The nearest are in Ellensburg, Walla Walla, and Pendleton.
- Most of the space is devoted to exhibits, some being Castle Performance Stage, Creative Kitchen, Toddler Play Area, and Union Pacific Train.
- In that 75% of one's intellectual capacity is developed at age 8, educational experiences such as those offered at the TRCM are valuable.
- Play is more than recreational. Analytical and perceptive skills are developed.
- The TRCM hones speech/language development, and skills such as the sensory-motor and the social.
- There are birthdays, seasonal activities, outdoor events, and others that engage attention and interest.
- There will be a spring festival on 4/17.
- Methods of support include partnership with other nonprofessional organizations, donations, subscription via the libraries, and admission fees for adults. Target has underwritten the Museum. There is a First Friday Dollar Night from September through June, 608 PM, occurring on the first Friday of each month.
- She bids us Come Visit and Play, consider volunteering, and perhaps participate on Fridays in the story-telling hour. One can read to kids in the castle from 10:30 to 11:30 AM.
