## **Program**

Pat Haggerty introduced today's speaker, Lisa Toomey, CEO of the Hanford Reach Interpretive Center. Lisa has an extensive background in education, wine tourism, the hospitality industry on Maui, and a number of years as a consultant assisting small business start-ups.

The Richland Public Facilities District will be constructing the Hanford Reach Interpretive Center on the west end of Columbia Park. The construction will take place on land currently leased from the Army Corps of Engineers to the City of Richland. The vision for the Reach is that it will be the gateway to the Hanford Reach National Monument. The Reach will serve as a nexus for



residents and provide visitors an opportunity to learn about the area, participate in tours, educational activities and special events. It will be a natural, cultural and historical resource for our area.

Lisa said that the Reach is finally under construction. As a means of generating interest in the Reach and its various program elements, the Reach is scheduling a variety of tours and activities. Some of the tours planned will begin prior to the building being completed they include meal and transportation and some examples follow: Tamastslikt Museum on the Umatilla Indian Reservation and Pendleton Experience on July 25—This tour will be 8 hours long. An afternoon spent underground with the guides of The Pendleton Underground. Yakima Valley: A Behind the Scenes Look at the Yakima Valley Museum: July 18, also 8 hours long. This is an exclusive tour of the collections of the museum and a wagon ride tour of the Toppenish Murals. Taste the Basin: Beer, From Hops to Bottle Sept 19, 2013, This is a tour of Hops field, the drying plant and Yakima Chief where they transform the hops to pellets, 8 hours.

More information about these and other tours can be found at Info@VisitTheReach.org. The building has been scaled back to match the available funds and should be completed in three phases. Phase 1 of the building construction is Infrastructure at \$3.6 million and began in February of 2013. The Phase II is the building construction and will begin in April of this year with a budgeted

of \$3.35 million. The final phase is the Gallery 1 Exhibits with a budget of \$2.4 million and a Grand Opening scheduled by Jun 1, 2014.

The Hanford Reach Interpretive Center is projected to have about 25,000 visitors the first year and about 20% less the following two years. They staff is taking a collaborative approach and working on partnerships with surrounding museums in our state. This should help to increase visitors and possibly create reciprocity for future exhibits.

The building will be LEED certified reducing operating costs and the sustainability valued by many people in our region. There will be a 300-500 seat amphitheater and indigenous plants will be featured in the landscaping. This is a well thought out project and we can look forward to the tours and Grand Opening.
