It seems evident from this presentation that music has its way of insinuating itself into the subconscious and creating pathways within the brain that are dormant as well as active. Music therapy, Bill's forte, makes use of this property to achieve results in instances where other methods fail. He cited anecdotes that have gladdened patients, family and therapist. The music he provides apparently activates these pathways and resonates within them, at times providing dramatic outcomes.

The healing phenomenon has been known for a long time. When traumatized WWII returnees responded to music therapy, a department was created at the U. of Michigan. The modality has since spread worldwide and is growing. Board certification is now a fact.

The support it achieves can be behavioral, physical, social, emotional, and spiritual, as well as in other areas. It has been successful in hospitals, rehab centers, out-patient settings, wellness programs, schools, nursing homes, senior centers, private practice, day care centers, hospice and bereavement programs.

It is non-invasive, non-pharmacological, and is used to achieve non-musical goals.

It has been efficacious in children and adults with specific needs (i.e., autism), Alzheimer's, dementia, neurological diseases such as Parkinson's, pain management, and in stroke therapy.

In many of these settings and conditions, music has broken barriers previously thought impenetrable. At times the responses have been dramatic.

Music therapy is now reimbursable by insurance companies. Licensure is fully granted by states.

The enthusiasm of the speaker, obvious immersion in his work, and the acquittal of his convictions by the results achieved, all bode well for music therapy's place in the health care armamentarium. Indeed, its praises will be sung.
