# **Program**

Mike Sinclair introduced the speaker Avante Jackson, the executive director of the Tri-Cities Pregnancy Network, now in their 25th year. This is a faith based community service agency providing real help and real answers. It is a not-for profit 501(c)(3) organization. They have centers in Pasco, Richland, and Kennewick. They receive no government funding.

They offer free services including: pregnancy testing, options counseling, prenatal life skills, and learning and earning classes. In addition, they offer CARE- Compassionate, Abortion Recovery and Encouragement. One of their areas of work is Life in 3D, a course designed to help youth make good decisions and analyze the messages they receive from the media in relationship to real experience, consequences and personal goals and values.

There were over 260 teen pregnancies last year in both Benton and Franklin Counties. This is particularly serious as 1/3 of single



moms and their families live in poverty. The network provides support for their clients to make the difficult choices they are facing. They work to help young mothers continue their education with New Horizons and Tri-Tech both having programs designed to provide the flexibility single moms or very young couples need to finish their educations.

Adoption is an option the Network suggests is worth considering. Steve Jobs was adopted and providing a good home for new babies can often be best accomplished through adoption.

Discover, Discern and Decide are the critical thinking skills the Tri-Cities Pregnancy Network stresses. Their work is a benefit to the community and Mrs. Jackson thanked Rotary for the new floor that was installed using funds provided by our club.
