The speaker was Donna Glass who informed the club about India Partners. The non-profit group works alongside a broad group of indigenous Christian grass roots agencies in India focused on alleviating poverty and injustice. We seek support from others who share our passion to empower change. It was begun in 1984 as a Eugene, Oregon-based, non-denominational Christian charity that is supported by private contributions, foundations and churches. It is engaged in numerous types of activities, mostly using third-party partners like Rotary International.

India Partners supports projects ranging from working with Rotary on polio eradication, building orphanages, schools, and rural medical clinics. They sponsor job programs for the disabled, self-sufficiency programs like aquaculture, skill training, and adult literacy.

They have also responded to natural disasters, provided rural water wells. In India, the child

mortality rate is tremendous before age 5 and 24 percent of children don't attend school. You can learn more at <www.indiapartners.org>.
