He directs the program that produces the Benton-Franklin Trends website and newsletter that weekly updates 175 data points about the Tri-Cities economy.

The "Trends" project began in 2006 in Spokane and has grown to include Walla Walla, Wenatchee, Northeast Washington, Grant County, Kootenai County, and now, Fresno, California.

local agencies, including the Port of Benton, and by a federal grant. It tracks 175 measures of date in 10 categories.

Dr. Jones proceeded to review some of the more important data with the group, including: The region now has 175,000 people. It has been growing very fast over the past decade. Richland's growth rate is about equal to the two-county average. The population has grown from 39,000 to 55,000 in 15 years. The median age of Richland's population is older by nearly 4.5 years. The non-white population of the Tri-Cities has been growing dramatically – by more than 38 percent over the past 10 years. That is not true for Richland. Richland's median family income is nearly \$70,000, more than anywhere else in eastern Washington. Richland has a much lower number of people living under the poverty line which in 2014 was \$24,000. Rick Schulte talked with Dr. Jones about this, noting that approximately 40 percent of kids in Richland schools were from families living under the poverty line. Many are moving into central Richland because of affordable housing and good schools from other Tri-Cities communities). Richland receives more than \$1 billion a year from taxable sales.
