sponsored by the Washington State University Extension service for over 30 years. Bob was accompanied by Jim Toomey, recently retired as executive director of the Port of Pasco, who has been an intern with Master Gardner program since his retirement 3 months ago.

Fellows explained that Master Gardeners are people who love gardening and are certified by WSU after 1 year of intense, research based training and field experience, and are recertified annually, requiring at least 35 hours.

With their love of gardening they teach residents to manage gardens and landscapes, address water and environmental priorities, reduce invasive species, and promote the connection of gardening to healthy living. He showed pictures of the Demonstration Garden in Kennewick, located behind the Mid-Columbia Library branch on Union Street, which is maintained as an outdoor classroom and place for research. Many types of fresh food are raised there, and 1700 pounds of produce is donated to the three area food banks each year. There is also a Children's Garden, which teaches children about plants and the growing process.

For 2014, the Master Gardeners are looking to redesign the Water and Rock Gardens with WSU landscape architecture students, upgrade their irrigation systems to provide more efficient use of water, start up new gardens in cooperation with Habitat for Humanity and Boys and Girls Club, and increase their outreach through electronic means and additional public programs.

How can they help us? We can bring our questions and concerns about gardening and we can learn to become better stewards of our environment. We can help them by volunteering to help out at the Demonstration Garden and by providing monetary support that allows them to serve more of our community... Everyone is welcome and now is the perfect time to get started!
