Program

Today's speaker was Skip Novakovich, the chairman of the Port of Kennewick Commission. Skip's list of awards and community interests would make a program in itself. He is a former Kennewick Man of the Year and Tri-Citian of the Year.

Much of Benton County lies within the Port of Kennewick. It was formed in 1915 and currently comprises 485 square miles. Like all port districts, the Port of Kennewick mission is to create jobs and support economic development.

Current projects include the Spaulding Business Park (which now contains 164,000 square feet of buildings, the 93-acre West Richland raceway, Clover Island, the Duffy's Pond area across from Clover Island, the Oak Street Industrial Park in East Kennewick, and Vista Field.

Vista Field has been very controversial as various factions fought to retain it as a general aviation field while others have advocated closing it and redeveloping the property for commercial or mixed use. The port recently retained a consulting firm to study the various options. Both of the proposed future options have merit, but



recently completed cost studies have resulted in many community organizations and the Tri-City Herald to come out in favor of redevelopment. The cost studies suggest that expanding the airport will cost \$43,510,188 against land sales of \$956,000. Redeveloping Vista Field will result in a cost of \$11,897,833 while land sales will account for \$15,613,750 or a potential net profit to the Port of \$4,715,917.

A Special Public Hearing will be held to come to a final resolution of the future of Vista Field on April 17, 2013 at the Tri-Cities Business and Visitor Center, 7130 W. Grandview. If you are interested in being heard, be there!
