

Program

Today was Duck Race Anticipation and Appreciation Day. Roy Keck noted that 2014 will mark the 26th year that our club has participated in the Mid-Columbia Duck Race. It will take place this year on October 11th. The Duck Race has raised approximately \$2.5 million over the past 26 years. Our club sold 9,458 tickets last year, and our goal for 2014 is to sell 10,000. The race generated \$25,000 for the club, our largest source of funding for our many programs.

Roy handed out certificates to last year's top sellers: Jon Putz (950 tickets), Bob Larson (375 tickets), and Jim Bauer (350 tickets). Roy also recognized Tom Cowan for his working in helping to set up the Duck Race's own 501 (C) (3) corporation, Ed Revell, who collected many of the prizes, and Dick McLean, who has done an outstanding job as ticket-master for the race for many years. Others recognized included Linda Gilmore, Stan Jones, Scott Kelley, Tom Kirchner, Larry Jecha, Gordon Bopp, Linda Bauer, Bob Tibbatts, Chris Smith, Marlene Oliver, Justin Raffa, Barbara French, Gary Schofield, Katie Swan, Phil Lemley, and Larry Lowry, for their contributions to the success of the race. Jon Putz, our champion ticket seller, gave his tips to the club for successful sales, noting that initiative is all you need to be successful.
