Program

May 1 is International Law Day. In recognition of that, Superior Court Judge Jackie Shea-Brown and local attorney Jeff Sperline gave a presentation. The presentation centered around procedural and substantive due process rights.

The duo gave a thorough explanation of the different standards that are used in criminal (beyond a reasonable doubt), civil (preponderance of evidence), and administrative (some credible evidence or substantial evidence) processes to guarantee that individual liberty interests are not infringed. In general, the bigger interest that is at risk of being lost, the more safeguards there are that are put in place to protect the individual.

These protections come from the Constitution, from the Bill of Rights, and from case law. Often times there are unenumerated rights that are found to exist, or to be within the penumbra (shadow) of a more explicitly stated law.

The presentation spoke about the differences between an employment claim in Federal Court (often cannot terminate for an arbitrary reason) and in State Court (Washington is an at will employment state, but a firing cannot occur for a “wrong” reason such as a protected class/sex/ race/religion, etc).
