Last Week's Program

We had a very interesting program on Rotary's Shelter Box program, presented by Jim Pickett, a regional representative of the Shelter box program.

The latest version of a Shelter Box tent, along with all of the other accoutrements included in the box, was set up in the room next to the meeting. Each box includes a custom-designed 10-person tent, thermal blankets, insulated ground sheets, multi-fuel stove, cooking utensils, tools, water purification equipment, waterproof ponchos, mosquito nets and children's activity pack.

Sixteen thousand of the 125-pound boxes have already been distributed in Haiti and 18,000 more have been distributed for disasters in more than half a dozen countries since the Haiti disaster.

Shelter boxes are distributed without regard to politics or religion and often reach the scene of a disaster within 24-hours because they are pre-positioned in five locations around the world. Boxes cost \$1,000.
