Brad Klippert

Our Eighth District State Representative, in full constabulary regalia and accoutered with some weighty hardware, bore an impressive curriculum vitae. This included considerable schooling at various sites, the ministry, the military, education, and awards. He is in transition from major to lieutenant colonel in the National Guard. He is in his first term in the legislature. He is an active patrol officer in the Benton County Sheriff's Department. He is an unabashed milk drinker.

He spoke about the mechanics of a bill once it is originated in the legislature, and the roles of the majority and minority party leaders therein. With good flow and without notes, he made several autobiographical and occupational statements, to wit:

- His dedication as legislator to public safety, i.e., home, family, community.
- A commitment to safe schools. If the schools are unsafe, he avers, everything in the country will come to a halt.
- Prosperity. He is in favor of this and believes that, despite all that is happening around us, the opportunities are in place. In the legislature, there is no income problem. Tax revenues are adequate. Gas tax income is an aid to transportation.
- He favors high-grade education, on the basic and college levels.
- A sound infrastructure is important. He went into some detail about the Alaska Way Viaduct and the disproportionate focus it receives as compared to the 7,000 miles of highway system in the state. The expense of this project has left quite a few others unfunded.
- Priorities in government could be improved. He pointed to the large cut taken by education in favor of other expenditures. This is contrary to principles stated by many legislators.
- Fiscal responsibility. With a \$9 billion deficit, the state received \$4.5 in stimulus money from the federal government, itself in need of funds. The arithmetic shows the depth of the hole in which we remain. (But, in view of an earlier statement, we are prosperous....)
- We need to be business-friendly. It helps the labor force and all else.
- He was high in his praise of Rotary, Service Above Self, and the Duck Race, from which all good things come.

Announcements

We received thanks for media coverage of the Scholarship event of the previous week. Judy Addis read a letter of thanks from Allied Arts. Her Community Projects Committee gave \$1000 to Beads Behind Bars, benefiting those in the Juvenile Detention System. She also received a letter of appreciation from NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness). Our gift allowed for 75 Care packages to be sent to those most needy in our community. These items, i.e., soap, shampoo, toothpaste, cannot be bought with food stamps.

Judy's committee also selected the Guardian Monitoring Program for support. Administered through Safe Harbor Crisis Center, it sees to 1000 individuals in our two counties. These people are physically or mentally incapable of caring for themselves. In that there are some

incidents of guardian abuse, our funds went to provide training for monitors who will conduct home visits, view financial records and verify that the needs of the individuals are met. (Ed. Note: It takes a good deal of research and discriminatory effort to identify the needs that Judy and her committee are able to address. This is impressive and commendable.)

Duck Race

Ed Revell reports that f48 prizes have been recruited, three from this club. The tickets are about ready to be printed. Ed states that the goal is to have everyone involved in the duck race. If selling is not one's forte, he will find ways for all to participate.
