Planned Parenthood of Central Washington was represented by Catherine Lopez, Mark Lee, and Timara Shindehite.

Their stated objective. To Create Intended Outcomes, is the principle encompassing the entire presentation.

Their mission is to provide comprehensive reproductive health care services and education programs; to advocate public policies which guarantee the right of every person to make voluntary decisions about sexuality, reproduction, and parenting; to maintain concern for underserved, low-income, adolescent, and minority populations.

Their services include birth control, pregnancy testing, annual checkups including Pap smears, abortion by medical or surgical means, adoption referrals, vasectomies, confidential HIV testing, STD testing and treatment, diagnosis and treatment of urinary tract infections, and menopause services including hormone replacement treatment.

Education programs deal with: abstinence, healthy relationships, teen dating violence, contraception, STDs, teen pregnancy prevention, HIV/AIDS, puberty, body image, reproductive anatomy and physiology, communication skills, gender identity, youth development and goal setting, sexual abuse prevention, male- and female-focused programming. They will speak to whoever requests them and in any venue.
