The Program

Randy J. Willis brought our program to us. Randy is familiar to many of us as a Past President and member of Columbia Center Rotary and as Co-owner and General Manager of the Columbia Basin Racquet Club. In his other persona Randy is a forceful proponent of organized competitive swimming

in the Tri-Cities. Randy has coached swimming in the Tri-Cities for 28 years and started the Tri-City Channel Cats Swim Team in 1979. His successful presentations to the Kennewick School Board (1983) and the Richland School Board (1993) resulted in establishing Boys and Girls High School swimming in the Tri-Cities. He will start his 20th year as coach of the Hanford and Richland High School Swim Teams this fall. Randy has served on Pool Bond Committees in Richland and Pasco and initiated the grassroots efforts uniting Kennewick, Pasco and Richland to create the Regional Aquatics Center.

The Tri-Cities Aquatic Center is the very thing that Randy came to talk about. On May 8th the Tri-Cities Public Facilities District Board approved a resolution setting a ballot proposition for a vote on a one tenth of one percent sales tax to



construct and operate the proposed regional indoor/outdoor aquatic facility and water park. That's 1¢ of sales tax for every \$10 you spend. The proposition would go on the August 6th primary election ballot.

Randy started his remarks by quoting a 2011 community survey of Tri-Cities area residents to determine residents' preferences among four possible regional projects. The aquatics facility option garnered a 72% approval rate from residents who were either "very supportive" or "somewhat supportive." He followed that up with information that pool space in the Tri-Cities has shrunk while support from Tri-Cities residents for other area pool facilities in Hermiston. Pendleton and Moses Lake has increased. The Tri-Cities facility as envisioned by the TCPFD Board is certainly structured to meet the competitive swimming and the recreational needs of the Tri-Cities while competing very strongly with the other facilities in the area for recreational dollars.

The indoor portion of the new facility will have a 25 yd multipurpose competition pool with timing and scoring equipment; 1 meter and 3 meter diving boards; multipurpose lap, warm-up, warm down, training pool; Wave Rider; multipurpose water slides; activity pool (volleyball/basketball); leisure pool (sprays & play structures); River channel. The outdoor portion will have a wave/leisure pool; multiple water slides; River channel; volleyball & sand play areas. There will also be parking for 350 vehicles; changing rooms; viewing areas and concessions. The facility will be located at a 13 acre site on Sandifur Parkway (east of Road 100) in Pasco, just north of I-182.

The cost for the project is \$35 million. The operational costs are projected at \$3.4 million annually and include 12 fulltime employee positions, variable part-time and seasonal positions plus a set aside for future equipment replacement. Daily admission rates would be \$7 for youth (4-12); \$8 for teens (13-17); \$9 for adults; and \$7 for Seniors (65+). Revenues from user fees and concessions are estimated to generate approximately \$3 million annually leaving an estimated annual operational shortfall of \$400,000. The Board estimates that there will be sufficient revenue from sales tax proceeds to

cover the projected operating loss. I got all these facts and figures from the TCPFD website at www.tcpfd.org, check it out.

During the Q & A Randy said the sales tax increase would not end after the facility was completed, but would continue to support shortfall and for the financing of other projects of the TCPFD. He responded to a question of choosing a 25 yd pool over a 25 meter by pointing out that all indoor US competitions use a 25 yd pool. Marlene Oliver encouraged the use of ozone for purifying the water as they do in Europe. Randy responded that they would use a combination of ozone and chlorine. Marlene stood firm for ozone only.
