#### Arc of the Tri-Cities

Loneliness is a lugubrious hand to be dealt to any member of our species. Social creatures that we are, it is a heavy condition to endure. When this is superimposed on disability—or indeed results from it—it is all the more crushing. It was therefore uplifting to receive a presentation by Sue Pederson, who has recognized this condition, done much about it, and has motivated others in the continuing effort toward its alleviation.

The vehicle is the Arc of the Tri-Cities, an organization that has existed here for 50 years. It addresses those with developmental disabilities, giving them the wherewithal to feel part of their



schools and community. It recognizes their isolation, where they tend to be less socially accepted, in and out of the workplace.

One of the main concepts is the principle of Buddy Clubs, permeating the schools, in which people make it a point to associate with the afflicted. The Buddy Clubs foment social interaction, development of skills, and a sense of belonging. For the benefactors, it teaches them compassion and patience, valuable for later life. The players include teachers, students, special education personnel, and many more.

Activities include weekly school buddy club lunches, in which experiences and community events are shared, school-hosted socials, hockey, movies, and dances. There is always a good deal of eating at all of these events. The benefits of the buddy clubs: Social development, personal recognition at school and community levels, real life opportunities such as friendships in and out of school, socializing with positive role models. Said role models are carefully vetted; high expectations of them exist.

Basic skills are taught and learned: dancing, phone etiquette, use of a napkin, all more easily acquired with a peer buddy than a teacher.

A big event is the Buddy Club Prom. Kids with and without disabilities help in this, as do the parents.

Ed. Note: Could anything be nearer and dearer to the Rotary ethic than a presentation such as this? It is said that success in business largely depends upon finding a need and filling it. The need that the speaker saw and filled had nothing to do with business. It had to do with the heart. And that is better, by at least a light year.


