Judge Tom Kirchner

Tom opened the judging by asking for a couple of dollars from those who didn't attend the Installation Dinner last week. Jeanne Dillner donated in honor of the efforts in Nepal to treat earthquake victims. Diahann donated as she had her name in the paper, but also put in brags for her sons, one of who graduated from Hanford High School. Others put in for birthdays and anniversaries. Several anniversaries were acknowledged, including President Linda's parents who have managed to hang in there for 77 years. The Bauers are leaving July 10 for a 3 month road trip, including 15 home visits with fellow Rotarians.



Program

Gordon Bopp introduced our speaker, Bob Ferguson. Mr. Ferguson spent more than 50 years with the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) and its successor organizations, as well as the private sector. He is the author of two books on nuclear waste issues. Ferguson began his nuclear career as a reactor physicist and an operating supervisor at the historic "B-reactor" on the Hanford Site.

As AEC's Hanford Technical Director in the early 1970s, Ferguson was involved in the investigation of the historic 105,000-gallon leak of high-level nuclear waste from one of Hanford's single-shell underground storage tanks. This investigation led to the construction of double-shell tanks as a temporary solution and started a public debate about the need for permanent disposal of defense high-level waste.

Mr. Ferguson outlined the history of Hanford work and it's impacts on the economy of the Tri-cities. Discussion also centered on continuing clean up work at Hanford and the State's interests in the progress.



Ferguson also outlined the history of the Washington Public Power Supply, founded in 1957, and how it became Energy Northwest in 1998. The consortium's nuclear, hydro, wind, and solar projects deliver nearly 1,300 megawatts of electricity to the Northwest power grid. Current power projects

include White Bluffs Solar Station, Packwood Lake Hydroelectric Project, Nine Canyon Wind Project, and Columbia Generating Station nuclear power plant. Future considerations are for developing additional capacity using small modular reactors.
